Sales Tax on Massage

Effective October 1, 2006, the NJ Legislature extended the 6.625% sales tax to massage therapy, unless there is a doctor's note or prescription on file. We are happy the legislature realized the health and medical benefits of massage and has allowed this exception to the tax for virtually all massages.

**What We Need From You** – We must charge the 6.625% tax unless we have a doctor's note or prescription. There seems to be no limit on the period of time or on the number of massages covered, and doctors have been very cooperative. The information will be held in your confidential file.

What Should It Say? – The choice is up to your doctor, but here are a few reasons for massage.

- Muscle pain
- Stress reduction
- Promote healing of injuries
- Improve flexibility and range of motion
- Pain or soreness in (specify area)

**How to Obtain a Note or Prescription** – Doctors have been extremely cooperative since they know the benefits of massage therapy to your overall health. Call your doctor's office and explain you need a prescription for your massage to be tax exempt. You can remind them that you do not need any codes, since this is not for insurance reimbursement, just for our files to avoid having to charge you tax. Thank you.
